

The National Retirement Benefits Fund (the Fund) was established on 1st July 2012 for the private sector which composes of the private businesses, church denominations and public enterprises. The Fund operates on the basis of defined contributions, collecting compulsory and voluntary contributions from employers and their employees (members) towards their retirement. In addition, the Fund also manages the Government Social Welfare Scheme on behalf of the Tonga Government and owns shares in Tonga Development Bank (TDB) and Pacific Timber & Hardware (PTH) Ltd.

The Fund operates under the provisions of the National Retirement Benefits Scheme Act 2010; National Retirement Benefits Scheme (Administration) Regulations 2012; National Retirement Benefits Scheme (Amendment) Act 2014; and the National Retirement Benefits Scheme (Appointment of Directors) Regulations 2015.



CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT



With humility and respect, I present the Fund's 2020/21 Annual Report, explaining its achievements despite the continued unsettling impacts of Covid-19.

In response to the growing number of members registered and actively contributed to the Fund, contribution revenue also grew at the same time. For instance, while the Fund's membership increased by 13 percent (%) to a total number of 17,492, contribution revenue also increased by 9

percent (%) to \$12.37 million. Further, investment income also increased by 31 percent (%) to \$2.54 million and similar to previous years, all investment income earned was distributed to members.

The Fund continued to record its investments in the Tonga Development Bank (TDB) and Pacific Timber & Hardware (PTH) at fair value resulting in significant valuation gains of \$0.94 million. Such changes in investment valuations would be a major source of volatility in the future.

Notwithstanding the uncertainties created by Covid-19, the Fund continued to properly manage its liquidity levels. The total net assets available to pay-off members' retirement increased from \$59.41 million last year to \$69.99 million this year. During the year, the Fund paid out \$3.96 million to members who have either became redundant or had financial hardship in addition to normal retirement and migration. This is an 11 percent (%) decrease from last year and the majority of these payments were made in the months of July and August 2020, and March 2021.

The Fund continued to maintain its administration costs below the mandated 2 percent (%) Management Expense Ratio (MER) benchmark. This year, a milestone was yet achieved when MER dived further down from the 1.34 percent (%) last year to 1.03 percent (%), the lowest since 2012. This is due to tight control imposed over the Fund's expenditures and more efficient utilization of the Fund's resources.

The Fund continued to provide services for the implementation of the Government Social Welfare Scheme through timely payment of monthly stipends. During the year, \$3.86 million was paid to a total of 4,091 elderlyies in the form of direct credit to members' bank accounts following Covid-19 and its guidelines or in cash.

I am deeply grateful to the Board for their assistance and guidance to me and I would also like to thank the staff for their commitments and cooperation. Finally, to our members and employers, we thank you for your support and contributions during this difficult year.

GOVERNANCE

1. Board

The functions and powers of the Board are defined in the NRBS Act 2010 and Amendment Act 2014.

The Board of Directors consist of three representatives of employees, three representatives of employers, and one independent director with relevant experience and qualifications, who is nominated by the Chairman. The Director's tenure is three years and renewable and directors are, nominated from the churches, private businesses, and public enterprises and statutory boards.

This year's Board consists of representatives from the Churches and Private Businesses only as nomination of representatives from public enterprises and statutory boards is still pending due to a Cabinet decision of the previous government. The Board met eight times during the year.

2. Board Committees

The main function of the committees is to provide technical advice to the Board. The Investment Committee met once and the sub-committee also met once in June 2021 to discuss the staff remuneration and the assessment of the CEO's performance.

3. Other Boards

The CEO continued to be the Fund's representative in the TDB and PTH Board. Sesilia Grewe Halaholo as well as Tevita Tonga, the Finance Manager also represented the Fund at some meetings at the TDB and PTH Board as the Alternate Director.

4. Audit

The audit of the Fund's financial statements for the first six months was done by the external auditor, JK Chartered Accountants. The annual audit will be completed in October.

5. Prudential Supervision

Under the Microfinance Institutions Act in 2019, the Fund has provided monthly financial reports to the National Reserve Bank of Tonga (NRBT).

6. Policy Development

The Fund reviewed certain policies to strengthening governance and to align to existing requirements of the Fund and legislation. The government also reviewed the Social Welfare Scheme Policy.


Finance



Finance Team

1. Net Assets

The total balance for all members' accounts (net assets) continued to climb over time. It increased by 18 percent (%) from \$59.41 million in 2020 to \$69.99 million in 2021.



2. Management and Board Expenses


The management expenses ratio (MER) dropped to 1.03 percent (%) compared with 1.34 percent (%) last year. Both management and board expenses continued to be funded from the income of the Scheme using strict control on expenditures and efficient resource utilization. The total management expenses dropped from \$722,916 in 2020 to \$640,536 in 2021, a decrease of 11 percent (%) due to reduction in personnel, travel and office expenses. On the other hand, the board expenses increased by 8 percent (%) from \$101,985 in 2020 to \$110,413 due to the re-allocation of the Fund's legal and audit fees as board expenses in 2021.

3. Members' Life Insurance Premium


With the premium rate of \$18.12 per active member for the sum insured of \$5,000, the Fund's Self-Managed Life Insurance is the most affordable across the country. This is a 2 percent (%) decrease from \$18.48 per member in 2020.

The total number of life insurance payments decreased by 26 percent (%) from 31 in 2020 to only 23 members in 2021. As a result, the total amount of life insurance paid also decreased by 26 percent (%) from a total of \$155,000 in 2020 to \$115,000 in 2021.



4. Contributions Income

The contributions collected during the year amounted to \$12.37 million, an average of \$1.03 million per month. This is an increase by 9 percent (%) from the previous year's collection of \$11.40 million.




Operations

1. Membership

By the end of June 2021, the total number of employers registered was recorded at 866 which is a 5 percent (%) increase compared to the 825 employers in June 2020. Further, the total members registered and contributed to the Fund continued to grow by 13 percent (%) from a total of 15,425 in June 2020 to 17,492 this year.

The private businesses in Tonga continue to dominate the Fund's membership, both in terms of employees (members) and their employers. In 2021, 94 percent (%) of the registered employers in the Fund are private businesses employing 70 percent (%) of the Fund's members. The minority goes to employers from the Churches and Statutory boards and their employees.




While the majority (57%) of the total contribution revenue of \$12,376,363 for the year was contributed by members employed by privately owned businesses, members employed by the statutory boards came in second with 30 percent (%) while those employed by the churches contributed the least with only 13 percent (%).

5. Retirement Benefit Payments

A total number of 721 members withdrew some or all of their retirement funds under the various grounds permitted by the Act. This is a decrease of 7 percent (%) compared to last year of 773 members. The total amount of benefits withdrawn by these members amounted to \$3,847,596.49, a 10 percent (%) decrease from \$4,275,435.87 in 2020. This result was due to decreases in the number and amount of withdrawals in all ground except for normal retirement.




While almost half (48%) of the total number (721) of retirees withdrew their funds under financial hardship, the redundancy (35%) and the normal retirement (28%) ground for withdrawal continue to lead this department in terms of the total amount of funds withdrawn. This is because a member is only permitted to withdraw a maximum of \$2,000.00 under financial hardship at a time, as per the Fund's Financial Hardship Policy.

Investment

1. Investment Portfolio

The Fund's total investment portfolio increased from \$56,760,189.62 in 2020 to \$63,977,349.00. This 13 percent (%) increase is due mainly to increased contributions from salary increase, improved compliance, new employer and employee registrations and re-evaluation of equity investments.



2. Fixed Interest

While a \$1 million term deposit was redeemed from BSP, the new term deposits for the year amounted to \$7.8 million which contributed to the 16 percent (%) increase in the fixed term investment from \$44,563,342.22 in 2020 to \$51,501,495.84 in 2021. This \$7.8 million was all invested in the TDB due to their competitive interest rate. The rest of the term deposits are invested in TDB, BSP, MBF, ANZ and government bonds.


3. Equity

The Fund has received dividends from shares invested in both PTH and TDB. Total dividend received on shares increased by 100 percent (%) from \$332,167.48 in 2020 to \$664,505.00 in 2021. This increase was due to dividends received from shares invested in PTH.


4. Investment Income

The total investment income was recorded at \$2.5 million compared to \$1.9 million in 2020, an increase of 31 percent (%). This steep increase was due to dividends received from PTH Ltd. and increased number of matured term deposits.



5. Fund Earning Rate

The Fund's earning rate was 4.24 percent (%) compared with 3.69 percent (%) at the end of June 2020. This is an increase by 15 percent (%) and it reflects the increased investment income earned during the year and efficient management of the Fund's expenditures.



Complying Schemes

The Act states that an employer who provides a retirement benefit scheme for his employees may submit an application for exemption from contributing to the Fund. Due to non-compliance with the conditions for exemptions from the Fund, the Board had to revoke Tonga Power Ltd. and Tonga Gas Ltd's certificate of exemption.

As a result, six employers remained as complying schemes out of the original 15 employers. The remaining ones are Pacific Energy SW Limited, Electricity Commission, United States Peace Corps Tonga, E.M Jones Limited, National Reserve Bank of Tonga and the Church of Jesus Christ the Latter Day Saints.

Information and Communications Technology (ICT)

1. ICT Upgrade

A number of old hardware was replaced with new ones in order to maintain efficiency in the Fund's daily operation. These include new desktop computers to replace those that were between 3 and 5 years old, a new Commercial Printer to cater for the high printing volume, and a new ID Printer to cater for the ID printing requirement of both Schemes. Further, the Fund's Eset Antivirus was also renewed so that the Fund's computer systems remain protected against viruses.



ICT and Staff Administration Team

2. Work in Progress

The following works are still in progress:

- Installation of the PFsense firewall which is an upgrade from the current firewall;
- Installation of the Fund's website using Ubuntu (Linux). This is a switch from Microsoft Exchange in order to avoid paying the annual fee and license.
- Installation and configuration of the work email using Ubuntu so that employees are able to access their email from anywhere including their personal mobile phones.

We have audited the financial statements of the National Retirement Benefits Fund (the Fund) on pages 1 to 16, that comprise of the financial position as at 30 June 2021, the statement of comprehensive revenue and expense, statement of changes in members benefits and statement of cash flows for the year ended on that date and the notes to the financial statements that include accounting policies.

1. Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

Reporting Entity

The National Retirement Benefits Fund (the "Fund") is a defined contribution superannuation fund domiciled in Tonga. The address of the Fund's registered office is at Vaha'akolo Road, Nuku'alofa.

The Financial Statements are for the National Retirement Benefits Fund established under Section 7 of National Retirement Benefits Scheme Act 2010. The National Retirement Benefits Fund administers the Retirement Benefits Fund in accordance with the provisions of National Retirement Benefits Scheme Act 2010 and National Retirement Benefits Fund Amendment Act 2014 and thus responsible for the management and investment of the Fund.

The financial statements were authorized for issue by the Board of Directors on 14th October 2021.

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis, and the accounting policies have been applied consistently throughout the year.

Statement of compliance

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of the National Retirement Benefits Scheme Act 2010, and applicable and relevant generally accepted accounting practice as represented by International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS).

Presentation currency

The consolidated financial statements are presented in Tongan Pa'anga.

Other changes in accounting policies

There have been no changes in the Fund's accounting policies since the date of the last audited financial statements.

Critical accounting estimates and judgements

Comparative figures

Comparative information has been reclassified as appropriate to achieve consistency in disclosure with the current year.

Summary of significant accounting policies

The accounting policies that materially affect the measurement of the Statement of Financial Position, Statement of Comprehensive Income, Statement of Changes in Members' Benefits and Statement of Cash Flows are set out below.

(a) Foreign currency translation and measurement

The financial statements has been prepared and presented in Tongan Pa'anga. Foreign currency transactions are translated into Tongan Pa'anga (the functional currency) using the exchange rates prevailing at the dates of the transactions.

(b) Property, plant and equipment

The Fund does not have any property assets. All plant and equipment is measured at cost less depreciation and impairment.

Additions and Subsequent costs

The cost of an item is recognised as an asset or costs incurred subsequent to initial recognition are capitalised only when it is probable that future economic benefits or service potential associated with the item will flow to the Fund and the cost of the item can be measured reliably.

Disposals

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing the proceeds with the carrying amount of the asset. Gains and losses on disposals are reported net in the surplus or deficit.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated using the straight-line method to allocate their cost to their residual values over their estimated useful lives, as follows

Items with a life expectancy of less than one year or cost less than \$500.00 are considered to be consumable items.

Impairment of non-financial assets

Assets held at cost that have a finite useful life are reviewed for impairment whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying amount may not be recoverable. An impairment loss is recognised for the amount by which the asset's carrying amount exceeds its recoverable amount. If an asset's carrying amount exceeds its recoverable amount, the asset is regarded as impaired and the carrying amount is written-down to the recoverable amount. The total impairment is recognised in the surplus or deficit. Non-financial assets other than goodwill that suffered impairment are reviewed for possible reversal of the impairment at each reporting date.

Financial assets

Financial instruments comprise of investments in equity, government and other fixed interest securities, term deposits, trade and other receivables, cash and cash equivalents, loans and advances, and trade and other payables. The Fund classifies their financial assets in the following categories: at fair value through profit or loss, held to maturity, loans and receivables and available for sale. The classification depends on the purpose for which the financial assets were acquired.

Management determines the classification of its financial assets at initial recognition.

Financial instruments are recognised initially at fair value plus, for instruments not at fair value through profit or loss, any directly attributable transaction costs. Subsequent to initial recognition non-derivative financial instruments are measured as described below.

(a) Financial assets at fair value through profit or loss

This category has financial assets that are designated at fair value through profit or loss at inception. This largely consists of equity investments which are managed and evaluated on a fair value basis in accordance with the Fund's investment policy and reported by key management personnel on that basis. Upon initial recognition, attributable transaction costs are recognised in profit or loss when incurred. Subsequent to initial recognition, financial instruments at fair value through profit or loss are measured at fair value, and changes therein are recognised in the profit or loss.

(b) Held to maturity financial assets

Held-to-maturity investments are non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments and fixed maturities that the Fund's management has the positive intention and ability to hold to maturity, other than those that meet the definition of loans and receivables.

These are initially recognised at fair value including direct and incremental transaction costs and measured subsequently at amortised cost, using the effective interest method. Amortised cost is calculated by taking into account any discount or premium on acquisition and fees that are an integral part of the effective interest rate. The amortisation is included in interest income in the profit or loss. The losses arising from impairment of such investments are recognised in the profit or loss.

Term deposits, government securities and other fixed interest securities are included under this category.

(c) Loans and receivables

Loans and receivables are non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted in an active market. Subsequent to initial recognition, loans and receivables are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment losses. Loans and advances, cash and cash equivalents and trade receivables are included under this category.

Impairment of financial assets carried at amortised cost

The Fund assesses at each financial year end whether there is objective evidence that a financial asset or group of financial assets is impaired. A financial asset or a group of financial assets is impaired and impairment losses are incurred only if there is objective evidence of impairment as a result of one or more events that occurred after the initial recognition of the asset (a 'loss event') and that loss event (or events) has an impact on the estimated future cash flows of the financial asset or group of financial assets that can be reliably estimated.

(c) Revenue Recognition

Contributions

Contributions from employers and members are recorded when control of the asset is ascertained which is upon receipt of the contribution schedule forms from the employers and the registration of the forms by the Fund. The Fund does not accrue for contributions for which

no contribution schedule forms are received or received but not registered as it is not able to reliably estimate the contributions balance.

Interest income

Interest income is earned from investments such as government securities, other fixed securities, loans and advances and term deposits. Interest income is recognised using the effective interest rate method.

Movement in fair value of investments

Changes in the fair value of investments (including investment property) are recognised as income/(loss) and are determined as the difference between the fair value at year end or consideration received (if sold during the year) and the fair value as at prior year end or cost (if the investment was acquired during the period).

Grants income

Revenue from grants includes grants given by government organisations, their affiliates and third party agencies. Grants are recognised when they become receivable unless there is an obligation in substance to return the funds if conditions of the grant are not met. If there is such an obligation, the grants are initially recorded as income received in advance and recognised as revenue when conditions of the grant are satisfied.

Other revenue is recognized when it is received.

(d) Contribution Account and Rate

A Member must contribute to his Account five (5) per cent (%) of his annual salary applicable at the July Review Date. This is stated in the financial statement as Members Contribution Account.

The Employer must contribute to the Members Account seven and a half (7.5) per cent (%) of the Member's annual salary, effective on 1st July 2017. This is stated in the financial statement as Employers Contribution Account.

A Member may contribute additional amounts at such rate and amount as the Member determines. This is stated in the financial statement as Members Voluntary Contribution.

An Employer may contribute additional amounts at such rate and amount as the Employer determines. This is stated in the financial statement as Employers Voluntary Contribution.

Any individual who wish to join the Benefits Fund may register and contribute at such rate and amount as he or she determines. This is stated in the financial statement as Voluntary Contributors Contribution.

(e) Investment in joint ventures and associates

Joint Ventures

A joint venture is a binding arrangement whereby two or more parties have joint control and the parties that have joint control of the arrangement have rights to the net assets of the arrangement. The financial statements include NRBF's joint interest in jointly controlled entities, using the equity method, from the date that joint control commences until the date that joint control ceases. Under equity method, on initial recognition the investment in a joint venture is recognised at cost, and the carrying amount is increased or decreased to recognise the NRBF's share of the profit or loss of the joint venture after the date of acquisition.

Associates

An associate is an entity over which the NRBF has significant influence (20% or more voting power and Board representation) and that is neither a subsidiary nor an interest in a joint venture. Associates are accounted for using the equity method, from the date that the power to exert significant influence commences until the date that the power to exert significant influence ceases. Under equity method, on initial recognition the investment in an associate is recognised at cost, and the carrying amount is increased or decreased to recognise NRBF's share of the profit or loss of the associate after the date of acquisition.

(f) Trade receivables

Trade receivables are recorded at the amount due, less any provision for uncollectability.

(g) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash balances and call deposits. Bank overdrafts that are repayable on demand and form an integral part of the Fund's cash management are included as a component of cash and cash equivalents for the purpose of the statement of cash flows. Cash and cash equivalents are categorised as loans and receivables under financial assets.

(h) Employee entitlements

(a) Wages and salaries and leave

Employee benefits that are due to be settled within 12 months after the end of the period in which the employee renders the related service are measured at nominal values based on accrued entitlements at current rates of pay. These include salaries and wages accrued up to balance date, annual leave earned to but not yet taken at balance date, and any other leave entitlements.

(b) Other entitlements

The Fund pays increments to employees based on performance of the Fund and achievement of individual objectives by the employees. The Fund recognises a provision where contractually obliged or where there is a past practice, subject to performance evaluation.

(i) Payables and deferred income

Short term payables are recorded at their face value.

(j) Provisions

A provision is recognised for future expenditure of uncertain amount or timing when the Fund has a present legal or constructive obligation as a result of past events; it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation; and the amount has been reliably estimated. Provisions are not recognised for future operating losses.

Provisions are measured at the present value of the expenditures expected to be required to settle the obligation.

(k) Members accrued benefits

The liability for accrued benefits is the Fund's present obligation to pay benefits to members and beneficiaries. They are determined on the basis of the value of the contributions plus interest on investments, which arise from membership of the Fund up to the reporting date.

(l) Grants

The Grants and funding from Donor Funding Agencies have been recognized and accounted for under the Income Approach.

(m) Taxation

The National Retirement Benefits Fund income, including investment earning, is exempted from income tax and any other government impost (except consumption tax) under Section 13 of the National Retirement Benefits Scheme Act 2010.

(n) Retirement Benefit and Voluntary Contributor's Payment Recognition

Retirement Benefits and Voluntary Contributors Payments to Members are recognized at the time of payment.

(o) Members Insurance Premium

All Members' are insured on a Group Life Insurance Scheme which is self-managed by the National Retirement Benefits Fund with effect on 1st July 2012. The insured amount is fixed at \$5,000.00 per member.

(p) Insurance Fund

The Insurance policy for self-managing the group life insurance scheme and general insurance for motor vehicles has been adopted and is to be reviewed from time to time.

Receipts and payments are processed directly from the fund, and any excess of fund assets over the liabilities are reported separately in the Statement of Comprehensive Revenue and Expense. Each transaction is recognized at the time of payment.

(q) Voluntary Contributors Accumulated Fund

Voluntary Contributors Accumulated Fund was established to account for members who wish to contribute to their retirement benefit account.

The contribution revenue and payments are accounted for in the Statement of Comprehensive Revenue and Expense as Voluntary Contributors Contribution Account and Voluntary Contributors Benefits Payments respectively. The balances are transferred to the Voluntary Contributors Accumulated Fund Account at the end of the financial year.

2. Term Deposits
